1. Citation

This Order may be cited as the Diseases of Animals (Declaration of Stock-Free Zones) Order.

2. Declaration of stock-free zones

Any area specified in the Schedule hereto is hereby declared to be a stock-free zone for the purposes of control of disease.

3. Stock to be removed from stock-free zone

Any stock in an area declared to be a stock-free zone shall be removed forthwith by the owner or the person having possession or custody of such stock from such area.

4. Offences

Any person who contravenes the provisions of paragraph 3 shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding P1000 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year, or to both.

SCHEDULE

(1) Gaborone City and Farms comprising-

- (a) the remainder of the Farm Broadhurst B No. 4-KO, as shown on Diagram No. A620/1916;
- (b) the Farm Annex Bonnington being portion 1 of the Farm Broadhurst B No. 4-KO, as shown on Diagram No. 582/1926; and
- (c) lot 5384 (originally the Farm Broadhurst A No. 5-KO), as shown on Diagram A619/1916, with the exclusion of lot 6416 as shown on Diagram DSL 173/78,

as will more fully appear from Plan No. 246-KO deposited with the Director of Surveys and Lands, Gaborone.

(2) The vicinity of Motopi Government Veterinary Laboratory, namely, the area bounded by a continuous line outside the line described by the perimeter fence of the Government Veterinary Laboratory at Motopi, every point on which continuous line is 7 km from the nearest point on the line described by that perimeter fence, less so much of the area so bounded as lies south of the Boteti River.

(3) Areas of zones 16 and 17 as defined in Plan BP-223 deposited in the office of the Director of Surveys and Lands, Gaborone.

(4) Any area declared as a game reserve under the Wildlife Conservation and National Parks Act.
