**THE WILDLIFE (CONSERVATION AND MANAGEMENT)
 (NATIONAL PARKS) REGULATIONS**

Citation.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Wildlife (Conservation and Management) (National Parks) Regulations.

Interpretation.

2. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

“National Park” means both National Parks as defined in the Act and the Marsabit and Shimba Hills National Reserves and where specified, Marine National Parks and Marine National Reserves;

“prescribed fee” means a fee for entry into a National Park or a Marine National Park/Reserve as provided in Parts II to IV, both inclusive, in the Schedule;

“private motor vehicle” means any motor vehicle other than a motor vehicle licensed as a public service vehicle within the meaning of the Traffic Act;

“road” means the actual driving surface of any maintained road, or demarcated route for four-wheeled traffic, and includes prescribed bridges, crossings or drifts in a National Park;

“special car pass” means a pass to enter any National Park granted to the owner of any motor vehicle specified in such pass upon payment of the fee prescribed in Part IV of the Schedule;

“stopping-place” means any area, place or road which has been demarcated by the Director’s authority as such, by the erection or placing of a notice, sign or mark, as a place at or in which any person may stop, subject to such conditions as may be imposed by the Director.

3. (1) No person shall, except with the permission of the Director or an officer of the Service of the rank above the rank of Assistant Warden or an agent of the Director duly authorised in that behalf enter a National Park unless he has paid the prescribed fee or is one of the permitted occupants of a vehicle in respect of which a special car pass is in force.

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Entry to National
Parks.

(1A) There shall be two categories of fees for entry into a National Park, one for citizens of Kenya and the other for non-citizens of Kenya, as specified in the Schedule. and for the purposes of these Regulations a resident non-citizen excludes one holding a visitor's pass under the Immigration Act.

(1B) An application for a special car pass shall be accompanied by two passport-size photographs of the applicant and the application shall specify the applicant's nationality, residence status in Kenya and passport number or national identity card number.

(2) The Director or any officer of the Service or an agent of the Director duly authorised in that behalf, may refuse permission to any person to enter or be within a National Park if in his opinion the presence of such person in the National Park would be detrimental to the proper management and control of the National Park and any such person, may, if found within the National Park, be ordered to leave the National Park.

(3) In this regulation, "permitted occupant" means one of the persons entitled under the terms of a special car pass to enter a National Park in the car in respect of which any such pass is issued and is in force.

4. (1) The Director or any officer of the Service or an agent of the Director duly authorised in that behalf in writing may, for such periods or at such times as he may consider fit for the protection of animal or vegetable life, or for the safety of the public, or for the protection of a road, or for climatic reasons, or for any other reason do either of the following-

Closure of National
Parks

(a) close to the public any portion of a National Park or any road or part of a road within a National Park; or

(b) close to any class of people or kind of traffic, any portion of a National Park, or any road or part of a road within a National Park.

(2) For the purposes of these Regulations, any portion of a National Park, or any road or part of a road, whereon by authority of the Director there has been placed a notice, a sign, a mark, a fence, a gate or a barricade indicating that it has been closed either to the public or to any class of people or kind of traffic, shall be deemed to be closed.

5. (1) Except with the special permission of the Director or an officer of the Service duly authorised, no person shall—

Prohibited acts.

(a) enter or leave any National Park elsewhere than at a place approved by the Director as an entrance or exit; or

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- (b) be within any National Park unless he is in a stopping place, or unless he is in a motor vehicle designed to travel on not less than four wheels; or
- (c) be within any National Park or any portion thereof between the hours of 7.15 p.m. and 6 a.m.; or
- (d) drive, or cause to be driven, a motor vehicle at a speed greater than 40 km. an hour; or
- (e) cause a vehicle to be stopped on any road in such a manner as to obstruct or impede the passage of any other vehicles; or
- (f) drive or cause to be driven, a motor vehicle than on open and maintained roads; or
- (g) alight from or get out of, or stand up in/on a motor vehicle, except in a stopping place; or
- (h) display any notice or advertisement within a National Park, or on any boundary of a National Park; or
- (i) collect any money from members of the public, or sell any goods, or offer any goods for sale, or purchase any goods or carry on any trade, within a National Park.

Nuisances.

6. Except with the special permission of the Director or an officer of the Service, or of a duly authorised agent of the Director, no person, while within any National Park shall—

- (a) discard any refuse or litter; or
- (b) in any other way disfigure the National Park or part thereof; or
- (c) unnecessary cause or make any noise or do any act which is likely to disturb or annoy any other person.

Service badges,
uniforms, etc., not to
be worn.

7. Except with the special permission of the Director or an officer of the Service duly authorised or an agent of the Director, no person shall make use of or wear any badge, uniform or emblem authorized to be worn by officers of the Service or agent of the Director.

Enticement of
animals and use of
weapons.

8. Except with the special permission of the Director, no person shall—

- (a) entice, or cause to be enticed, any animal out of a National Park;
or
- (b) intentionally discharge any weapon; or
- (c) release any appliance, so that a projectile therefrom passes over

any portion of, or falls, within a National Park.

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Penalties.

9. Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of these Regulations (including regulation 5) or of any lawful order or directive given thereunder by the Director or by an officer of the Service shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding two thousand shillings or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months, or to both.

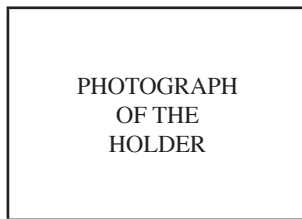

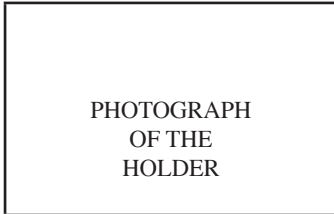

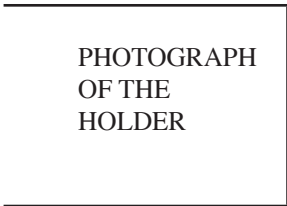

3. There shall be payable a non-refundable reservation fee in respect of all “designated special camp sites” at the following rates:

- (a) Designated special camp site reservation fee per week or part thereof shall be seven thousand five hundred Kenya Shillings.
- (b) Guided foot or horse safaris per person per day shall be one thousand shillings and five hundred shillings per half-day (4 hours) whether the person is alone or in a group, in addition to the park entry fees.
- (c) Cancellation fee for special camp sites/all reserved sites is seven thousand five hundred Kenya Shillings.

4. For the purposes of these Regulations, a “daily fee” is a fee for one day (twenty-four hours or part thereof) of continuous stay within a specified national park.

5. “Student” is hereby defined as an individual from a recognised tertiary institution visiting the parks for purposes of learning about conservation through documented and organised arrangement with that institution. This excludes students on personally arranged holidays.
