FEDERAL COMMISSION (PRIVILEGES AND IMMUNITIES) ACT

An Act to provide for the immunity from civil proceedings, of members of the Police Service Commission, the Federal Judicial Service Commission and the Federal Civil Service Commission and for the privilege of the documents of such Commissions.

1. Protection of members of the Commission


No member of a Commission shall be liable to be sued in any court of law for any act done or omitted to be done in the due exercise of his duties as such member.

2. Privilege of documents

Any report, statement or other communication or record of any meeting, enquiry or proceedings which a Commission may make in the due exercise of its functions or which any member of a Commission may make in the due performance of his duties, shall be privileged in that its production may not be compelled in any legal proceedings if the Attorney-General of the Federation certifies that such production is not in the public interest.
